

Our summer holidays are here again Ma'am told us all, as we jumped up and down We squealed with delight and looked at her face As she gathered us all in a warm embrace


May this holiday be a blessing sweetheart Never let that smile from your face depart May your days be filled with love and cheer While you fill others' lives with joys so dear


